Note: if your public comment statement is read aloud by Film Commission staff during an agenda item, this will count as your one opportunity for public comment on that specific item. You will not be able to raise your hand to make additional public comment on the same item if your statement has already been read aloud.

**Oral Comment:**

Public comment in regard to specific agenda items will be taken at the end of the item. During General Public Comment, members of the public may address the Commission on matters within the Commission's jurisdiction and not otherwise on this agenda. Each speaker may speak for up to three minutes per agenda item, unless the Chair has announced a different length of time at the beginning of the meeting. Speakers may not transfer their time to another person. Any person speaking during a public comment period may supply a written summary of their comments to be included in the minutes if it is 150 words or less.
